





When a young Aboriginal boy finally receives the footy boots he has been saving for, they give him the confidence he needs to face the struggles in his life. He wears them everywhere, showing them off to his friends and family as he goes.

But when his boots go missing, his grandfather helps him realise there is much more to him than what he wears on his feet – he can draw strength from the support of his family and his connection to culture and Country.



Hakea Hustler is an experienced teacher who has taught around Australia, including in remote Aboriginal communities. Hakea is committed to Indigenous education with a focus on story as learning and empowerment.

Carl Merrison is a respected Jaru/Kija man who was Western Australian runner-up Australian of the Year Local Hero in 2016. He has worked for over 10 years alongside Aboriginal youth as a mentor and coach.

Carl and Hakea's first book, Black Cockatoo, was a Children's Book Council of Australia Honour Book for Younger Readers. The Beautiful Night, written by Carl Merrison and Hakea Hustler and illustrated by acclaimed Australian children's book illustrator Dub Leffler, will be published in September 2023 and Loved You Then, written by Carl Merrison and Hakea Hustler, will be published in September 2024.



Parents will relate to the way children fixate on things they love, and little readers will delight in Charlie's obsession with these giants of the sea.

Libby Gleeson is an award-winning author of more than 30 books for children and teenagers, including Red (winner of the Prime Minister's Literary Award for Children's Fiction 2013), One Sunday, Eleanor, Elizabeth, Love Me, Love Me Not and the Hannah series. Libby won the prestigious Lady Cutler Award 1997, Dromkeen Medal 2011 and Nan Chauncy Award 2015 for her distinguished service to children's literature. In 2007 she was made a member of the Order of Australia for her contributions to literature as an author and as an advocate for the development of literacy and learning in schools.

Hannah Somerville is a bestselling picture book illustrator who creates enchanting watercolour, gouache and digital illustrations. Her picture book Digby & Claude, written by Emma Allen, and Anisa's Alphabet, written by Mike Dumbleton, were selected as Notable Books by the Children's Book Council of Australia.

A beautifully written and poignant picture book about our changing environment and what it means to get older, from one of Australia's most critically acclaimed and award-winning writers.

He's old, this gargoyle. Very old. Older than me. Older than anyone. He looks tired. I think, if I had a seat, I would have given it to him.

He shuffles past me and stands near the door and watches the city smushing past. I thought I heard him sigh. It was an echoey, achy, hollow sort of sound, like the wind when it gusts down lanes and through tunnels and in and out of the big drains that stretch under the city.

A small spout of water drips from his mouth and splats on the ground like rain. Or tears maybe.

This gentle allegory about ageing and our changing environment will stay with you long after you have finished reading. Another masterpiece from Zana Fraillon that is bursting with heart.

Zana Fraillon was born in Melbourne, but spent her early childhood in San Francisco. Her 2016 book The Bone Sparrow won the Amnesty CILIP Honour, ABIA Book of the Year for Older Readers and the Readings Young Adult Book Prize. It was also shortlisted for the Guardian Children's Fiction Prize, Gold Inky, CILIP Carnegie Medal, Prime Minister's Literary Awards and the Queensland Literary Awards. Her book The Lost Soul Atlas won the 2020 Aurealis Award for Best Children's Fiction and was shortlisted for the 2021 Children's Book Council of Australia Book of the Year for Older Readers.





Randa Abdel-Fattah is a Palestinian Egyptian Muslim writer, academic, former lawyer and the multi-award-winning author of 11 books published in over 20 countries, including multiple translations, stage productions in the US and Australia, and a graphic novel series. Randa was nominated for Sweden's 2019 and 2018 Astrid Lindgren Award, the world's biggest children's and young adult literature award.

Maxine Beneba Clarke is an Australian poet and writer of Afro-Caribbean descent. She is the ABIA and Indie award-winning author of The Hate Race, Foreign Soil and Carrying the World. She is the author of five books for children, including Wide, Big World, Fashionista, the Children's Book Council of Australia and Boston Globe/Horn Prize award-winning picture book The Patchwork Bike, and the critically acclaimed picture book When We Say Black Lives Matter.


